Maternity care across the Mackay HHS is supported by a multidisciplinary team which includes midwives, nursing, medical officers including obstetricians and gynaecologists, paediatric staff, allied health practitioners and our support staff.

## EVERY PATIENT'S



As a first-time mum I opted for the program that provided me with the same midwife throughout my entire pregnancy at the Proserpine Hospital. My midwife made me comfortable and I felt supported. It gave me confidence in knowing I had her in my corner and she knew me and had shared my journey with me. During my birth my midwife walked me through every step of my labour. When things took a turn and I required an emergency caesarean, she was there for me and guided me through my panic and anxiety. The established relationship with my midwife helped me cope.

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I have had three babies at Mackay Base Hospital. With my first I had planned to birth in the Birth Centre, but got gestational diabetes and it was recommended I birth in the Women's Health Unit Birth Suite. Due to my medical history my second pregnancy and birth were through the Women's Health Midwifery Group Practice. For my third pregnancy and birth, I went through the Kem Kem Yanga Midwifery Group Practice. The Kem Kem Yanga Team supported me during my pregnancy, birth and after care of my baby girl. The midwives were there every step of the way and were very knowledgeable and helpful, and assisted in providing me with culturally appropriate resources to support my baby and I.







I was induced at 38 weeks at the Mackay Base Hospital. I had gestational diabetes and my baby was measuring small. I was induced at night and the next morning they said my induction had failed and labour was not progressing. Due to multiple reasons, I had my baby girl through a caesarean. The midwives, nurses, doctors and theatre staff provided excellent care to my baby and I and supported us throughout our hospital journey.




