Nurse Reskilling Program

10th July – 4th August 2023 (4-week program)

Program Aim:

The Nurse Reskilling Program aims to prepare the qualified RN/EN for return to work in the acute care setting after a period of absence, through education and supported clinical practice.

Program Description:

This four-week program is ideal for RN/ENs who have maintained their AHPRA registration but have been absent from the acute care environment and wish to regain those skills. It is a blended educational package which includes a combination of self-directed learning modules, face-face education and simulation and supervised clinical practice in the Mackay Hospital and Health Service.

Who Should Apply?

- Registered and Enrolled Nurses who have a current registration with Australian Health Practitioners Regulation Agency (AHPRA), have been absent from the acute care setting and wish to refresh their contemporary clinical skills.
- The applicant will be required to commit to 4 weeks (5 days a week) of supervised learning and the completion of pre-reading Modules of Learning and Qld Health Mandatory Modules prior to commencement.

Fees:

Application is free, but successful applicants will be charged a course fee of \$300.00.

- □ A current curriculum vitae detailing clinical work history
- Evidence of current registration with Australian Health Practitioners Regulation Agency (AHPRA)

Positions are limited, so successful applicants will be awarded according to merit and will be asked to provide further evidence of:

- Personal Indemnity insurance
- Immunisation status
- Proof of ID and passport photo for a security pass
